Scarface's Physical Examination

Temperature: ~~ (normal=100-102.5)

Heart Rate: wnl (normal dog=60-160, normal cat=120-240)

Respiration: wnl (normal dog=16-40, normal cat=16-40)

Body Condition: Scarface's body condition and weight are normal. There is a slightly tucked-in waist and the ribs and spine are palpable.

Ears: Both the ear canal and pinna are normal. Scarface's tympanic membrane (ear drum) is normal and he seems to hear fine.

Eyes: Scarface's eye(s) are normal. The eyeballs, eyelids and associated structures appear normal. He appears to have normal vision.

GI/Abdominal Palpation: Scarface's abdominal palpation is normal. This means the kidneys, intestines, liver and other abdominal organs that are palpable are normal (no masses, lumps, fluid, pain).

Heart/Cardiovascular: Scarface's heart is normal. The heart sounds are clear with no murmurs or arrhythmia heard. The pulses are normal.

Lungs/Trachea: Scarface's lungs sound normal with no fluid, crackles or wheezes. The trachea sounds normal and palpates normal.

Lymph nodes/Thyroid gland: Scarface's external lymph nodes (submandibular, pre-scapular, axillary and popliteal) all palpate normally. There are no abnormal structures associated with the thyroid gland (cats).

Mouth/Teeth/Gums: Scarface's oral examination is normal. There is no evidence of tartar on the teeth or gum disease.

Musculoskeletal: Scarface's muscles are in good condition. The skeleton is observed to be normal with no lameness noted.

Nervous System: Scarface's nervous system is normal.



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There are no observable defects in the nerves, spinal cord or brain function.

Nose/Throat: Scarface's nose and throat are normal. Air flows freely through nostrils, no discharge is noted and there are no difficulties with vocalizing or swallowing.

Urinary/Reproductive: Scarface's urogenital system is normal. The urinary system is functioning normally. The reproductive organs examined are normal.

The following abnormalities were found with Scarface's skin/haircoat:

There is absence of hair (alopecia). Generalized moth-eaten appearance to hair coat. Skin is thickened, with crusts and pustules present. Food pads thickened. Scarface is markedly pruritic.

P: Medications

Cephalexin 500 mg: give one capsule orally every 12 hours for 14 days.

Medications

Ivermectin is an antiparasitic. Side-effects may occur in ivermectin-sensitive breeds including depression, wobbliness, coma and death. Do not use at high doses in pets sensitive to ivermectin.

1% Ivermectin dispensed for oral dosing once daily. Dose as follows:

- Days 1-4: 0.3ml
- Days 5-8: 0.6ml
- Days 9-12: 0.9ml
- Days 13+ (until recheck in 3 weeks): 1.1ml

A total of 25ml dispensed



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VetSolutions Aloe and Oatmeal shampoo dispensed-- bathe as necessary

Recommended Treatment: Re-check in 21 days for vaccine booster and recheck on skin. If skin is resolving, we will do a repeat skin scraping. If skin is NOT responding well, increase to 1.4ml SID Continue Ivermectin until 2 negative skin scrapings 2 weeks apart.
